1. General

The particulars you provide will become part of the Motor Vehicle Register. Collection, dissemination and release of this information is authorised by Part 17 of the Land Transport Act 1998. Corresponding information held on other parts of the Land Transport Register may be amended.

Under the Electoral Act 1993, s 263B, the Electoral Enrolment Centre operates an authorised information matching programme with Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency. The purpose of this programme is to assist in keeping the Electoral Roll up-to-date.

2. Continuous vehicle licensing

Vehicles in the following categories are not subject to continuous vehicle licensing:

- trailers (3500kg and under)
- trailer-type caravans (3500kg and under)
- vintage vehicles (over 40 years of age)
- veteran vehicles (pre 1 January 1919)
- all terrain vehicles (ATVs)
- class EA and EB vehicles
- any agricultural machinery
- tractors and mobile machines.

These vehicles are not required to have an exemption from licensing if they're not used on a public road. An exemption may be requested to retain the vehicle on the Motor Vehicle Register.

3. Road user charges

This application will not exempt your vehicle from road user charges (RUC). For more information go to www.nzta.govt.nz/ruc-exempt

4. Exemption period/removal of exemption

The exemption period will begin from the end of the current licence/exemption. If this vehicle doesn't have a current licence/exemption, the exemption will begin from the date of application. The minimum exemption period is 3 months.

When the exemption expires you'll need to either relicense the vehicle or apply for another exemption.

If you license a vehicle subject to continuous vehicle licensing before the minimum exemption period has passed, licensing fees will be payable from the date the previous licence/exemption expired. You must pay any outstanding licensing fees at the time of application. If you intend to use this vehicle on a public road before the expiry of the exemption you must license it at www.nzta.govt.nz/online or by lodging an *Application to license motor vehicle* form (MR1B) at a Waka Kotahi agent.

5. Stolen vehicles

If this vehicle has been stolen, please contact the NZ Police to report the vehicle stolen first. Then call us on 0800 108 809.

6. Cancellation of registration

If this vehicle is removed from the road permanently, you don't need to apply for an exemption. You should cancel the registration of the vehicle by lodging an *Application to cancel registration* form (MR15), and surrendering the registration plates to one of the following Waka Kotahi agents - AA, VINZ, VTNZ, independent agents.

7. Model

State the manufacturer's designation (eg Corolla, Commodore) - not the year of manufacture.

8. Fees

Licensing fees include the appropriate licence fee payable under Part 17 of the Land Transport Act 1998. Where applicable, they may also include:

- an accident compensation levy payable under the Accident Compensation Act 2001 (except for trailers and a few specified vehicles)
- a transport service licence fee.

There is no administration fee for an exemption application.

9. Outstanding licensing fees

If you sell an unlicensed vehicle which is subject to continuous vehicle licensing or its registration is cancelled because it's remained unlicensed for over one year, outstanding licensing fees will remain payable. The debt will be referred to our debt collection agent who is empowered to order payment of the outstanding licensing fees and any additional costs.

10. Address
